Bishop Graves Calls for Special Annual Conference Session

Bishop David Graves, episcopal leader of the South Georgia Annual Conference, in accordance with ¶603.5 of the 2016 United Methodist Book of Discipline, calls for a special session of the annual conference on Sunday, May 21, 2023. The meeting will begin at 4 pm using the Zoom Webinar platform in conjunction with an online voting system. The sole purpose of the special called session of the Annual Conference* is to complete the process of ratifying the current requests for disaffiliation of local churches who have met the requirements outlined in ¶2553 of the Book of Discipline and who have met the published South Georgia Conference deadlines.

The special session will consider only matters pertaining to this call; no other business can be considered.

Dr. Scott Hagan to Serve as Superintendent of Coastal & Northeast Districts



Bishop David Graves announces the projected appointment of one new District Superintendent to the South Georgia Conference Cabinet, effective June 2023. The Rev. Dr. Scott Hagan, currently serving as senior pastor of Statesboro First United Methodist Church, will be appointed to serve as superintendent of both the Coastal and Northeast districts.

Dr. Hagan was ordained an Elder in The United Methodist Church in 2006. Born in Brunswick, Georgia to Dan and Miriam Hagan, he grew up in Statesboro with his brother, Kirk. Along with his wife, Julie, they have served local churches in Fayetteville, Albany, Waverly Hall, Columbus, Bonaire, and Statesboro.

Dr. Hagan will join Rev. Doreen Smalls, the Rev. Dr. Paula Lewis, and the Rev. Dr. Jay Harris on the Appointive Cabinet in the new district leadership structure. Dr. Harris will assume an expanded role as the Superintendent of Clergy and District Services. In this structure, the six existing districts will remain as is. However, there will now be three regions composed of two districts each. One District Superintendent will oversee one region.

Along with Dr. Hagan's service to the Coastal and Northeast districts, Rev. Smalls will give oversight to both the Northwest and Southwest districts while Dr. Lewis will oversee both the North Central and South Central districts.

Pittman Park UMC Evaluates Accessibility and Comfort for Individuals Living with Disabilities



Easily recognized, Pittman Park United Methodist Church is frequently involved with the Statesboro community by serving as volunteers at many events, such as local soup kitchens, and even hosting a few of their own, namely their Trunk or Treat. Recently, however, the church has been striving to serve its congregation and the local community in a whole new way: through prioritizing inclusivity and evaluating the accessibility and comfort of their church's environment for individuals living with disabilities.

While the church building itself is already accessible in many aspects, featuring ease of entry and adjustable row seating for those in wheelchairs, leadership recognized it still had room to grow and desired to improve. This desire to better serve their congregation is the beginning of a moving story between two friends - a children's pastor with a heart for change and a dedicated mother with a vision for her family, both of who overcame individual anxieties to have a difficult yet powerful conversation, sparking significant change within the walls of Pittman Park UMC.

Appointment Making Process and the Report to the Bishop and Cabinet

Each year the Cabinet utilizes online tools to help facilitate the appointment making process. The forms below are used to populate these tools and ensure accurate information is used as the Cabinet discusses clergy appointments. Your help in completing these forms in a timely manner is appreciated.

<u>Appointment Preference: Report to the Bishop and Cabinet</u>

Form sent by: January 4, 2023 | Deadline to return: February 1, 2023

No later than January 4, the District Office will mail to each clergyperson a form entitled "Report to the Bishop and Cabinet" where information relative to the appointment process for 2023 will be recorded. The District Office will also mail a similar report to each SPRC chairperson that solicits similar information. Each party is to sign the other's form after it is completed prior to returning to the District Office. Please remember that the deadline to return forms to the District Office is Monday, February 1.

In order to provide one last snapshot for clergy to review their information prior to the printing of the "Master Move Book," clergy will be asked to login to their dashboard (links above) between January 18 and January 26. There is nothing to complete; it is simply a one-page sheet to review. If there are any changes that need to be made clergy will need to contact their District Office. There are 5 sections to review:

-Charge Membership Information for 2022 (pulled from the December Discipleship Report)

-Charge Apportionment Information for 2022 (pulled from the Administrative Services Office)

-Appointment Information as of 7/1/2022 (pulled from the Conference Database)

-Compensation Information for 2023 (pulled from the Clergy Compensation Form)

-Sexual Ethics Workshop Last Attended (pulled from the Conference Database, see note below)

Again, if there are any changes that need to be made please contact your District Office. Please note that the Charge Membership and Apportionment Information will be blank for Extension Ministers. The deadline to review this form, and to request changes to be made, is January 26.

<u>Cabinet Appointment Making Dates</u>

The Appointive Cabinet will be doing the work of appointment making on the following dates. Consultation is a year-round process, and District Superintendents will continue consultations with Pastors and SPRC as needed throughout the appointment making process.

-February 9-10, 2023 (Appointment Making Meeting)

-February 23-24, 2023 (Appointment Making Meeting)

-March 8-10, 2023 (Appointment Making Meeting)

-March 28-29, 2023 (Appointment Making/Review)

-Clergy and SPR Committees will begin to be informed of the appointments affecting them when it is appropriate. At the same time, they will be notified when they can share the information with the congregation. Once the congregation has been informed, the information can be shared with others. Please note: Because changes sometimes occur after the projection of an appointment, the only public release of the appointments will be at the conclusion of the 2023 Annual Conference Session.

Sexual Ethics Workshops

As you may remember, when our Conference Pastoral Counselor went on medical leave, we had to cancel our workshops scheduled for February and April of 2022, and had to postpone future workshops while we planned how to move forward. We are now able to announce plans for our quadrennial Sexual Ethics Workshop, which is being led by our Conference Ministerial Services Office. We are moving to a quadrennial emphasis model like many other annual conferences follow. This means that all clergy will need to attend one of three workshops being offered in the first quarter of 2023 in order to be appointed this June of 2023 (dates to be announced soon). Please note that this will satisfy your requirement for the quadrennium. Part of the workshop will be completed online, and the other part will be completed in-person. Both parts are needed to satisfy the requirement. Stay tuned for more information coming soon.

Orientation for Moving Pastors

Bishop Graves and the Appointive Cabinet will host a workshop for full-time moving clergy on a date to be announced. Superintendents will release the location and time for this event in the spring. Please remember that this is a mandatory meeting for all moving pastors.

Preaching Schedule & Moving Day

In an effort to encourage clergy to take a Sabbath break, the Bishop and Appointive Cabinet invite all clergy, especially those who are projected to move to a new appointment, to observe the following:

- Preach in Local Churches as Scheduled June 4, 2023: For Clergy moving to a new appointment, you are encouraged to make this your final preaching Sunday in your current appointment.
- -Pulpit Supply Sunday June 11, 2023: Clergy are encouraged to coordinate with their SPRC to have retired clergy or lay supply fill the pulpit to preach this Sunday. All clergy are invited to participate in this Sabbath break but clergy on the projected move list are strongly encouraged to do so.

-Moving Day – June 14, 2023

Annual Conference Meeting Dates

The 2023 regular session of the South Georgia Annual Conference is set for June 4-6 at UGA Tifton Campus Conference Center in Tifton, Ga, during which Bishop Graves will fix the appointments for 2023-2024. Also, we have a called session of the Annual Conference set for May 21, 2023, at 4:00pm, to be held by Zoom.

Annual Conference Materials

All Annual Conference materials for the 2023 session will be placed on the conference and district websites to download and print or save to an electronic device prior to Annual Conference. The Book of Recommendations will also be available to order at a minimal cost through lulu.com. All clergy for whom we have an email address will receive a notification when Annual Conference materials are available. If an email address was entered during Charge Conference season for the lay member to Annual Conference from your church that person will receive an email as well. However, clergy are requested to check with the church's lay member of Annual Conference to make sure they receive all of the Annual Conference materials. Information will also be included in the district newsletter and conference communications.

Apportionments

Thank you for your continued faithfulness in giving to the mission and ministry of The South Georgia Conference and The United Methodist Church. The final day to make payments on your local church's 2022 apportionments is January 6, 2023. Payments must be turned into the Administrative Services Office by this date. As a reminder, there are electronic means available in which to pay apportionments.

Statistical Tables Information

The Statistical Tables will launch on January 10, 2023, and must be completed by February 28, 2023. Statistical tables will be filled out through the new ACstats website. Login information will be emailed to the pastor and treasurer/financial secretary in early January.
