- ➤ Participated in Intercultural Development Inventory (IDI) Training, which is introduction training to cultural competency in an effort to serve and live together in the life of the faith community. The IDI training is a tool to accomplish missional goals and to increase and map out individual and organizational developmental paths, and to make Disciples of Christ within and outside the church.
- Developed Multiculturalism Task Force Resource Booklet for the South Georgia Conference for people in ministry settings, the Church and Conference. The Task Force joins with others around the world in addressing the relevance and inclusion of Multiculturalism Church and Society. This guide offers resources of printed materials, links to websites, as well suggestions to start conversations designed to encourage dialogue to help people identify, understand, and embrace the reality of Multiculturalism: the Multicultural Church. The resource booklet is intended to help guide people to a deeper understanding of the inclusion of Multiculturalism and identify resources within the United Methodist Church.
- ➤ Authentic Conversations Webinars around Multiculturalism that engage people in courageous conversations about race, ethnicity, gender and other diversities in our Conference and communities that are not part of the United Methodist Church.
