## Multiculturalism and Undocumented Neighbors Task Forces provide resources

At the 2017 Annual Conference session, the South Georgia Conference approved two resolutions, statements that represent the position of the conference on a subject. The first, a "<u>Resolution in support of a Coordinated Action on Behalf of Undocumented Neighbors</u>," called on the presiding bishop to form a task force to develop a strategy to educate clergy and laity about the history of immigration and human and civil rights concerning undocumented members of society and to encourage South Georgia United Methodists to engage in works of piety and mercy towards their undocumented neighbors. The second approved resolution, the "<u>Multiculturalism Taskforce Resolution</u>," asked that the bishop appoint a diverse task force to consider the implications of multiculturalism education.

Over the past year and a half, these two Task Forces have worked to help churches address the issues of diversity and immigration with the church and with society.
